



BE CALIGARI! — THE VIRTUAL CABINET

Exhibition, February 13 — April 20, 2020

Deutsche Kinemathek – Museum for Film and Television

Faces painted white, a reflection of the horror of the First World War, the dreamless expression of intoxication, the self-forgotten pallor of the somnambulist. *Das Cabinet des Dr. Caligari* — magic words of cinema history that signal a drifting off into unreal worlds. The film, directed by Robert Wiene and released in early 1920, fascinates with its unique style; it is an uncompromising work. The carnival is full of marionettes and puppet-like activity. Cesare, who Conrad Veidt plays as though sleepwalking, is awakened by Caligari, Werner Krauß — an act of creation. The film was marketed with the graphic advertising text "Be Caligari!" in the form of a spiral.

On the occasion of the film's centenary, the Deutsche Kinemathek is dedicating an exhibition to this expressionist masterpiece. Based on the marketing campaign of the time, the presentation describes the history of the film's production and success. To this day, the reconstructed models and drawings, which were made as early as the 1950s, offer insights into the spectacular cinematic style. In addition to the original version of the silent film, restored by the Friedrich Wilhelm Murnau Foundation in 2014, the VR film *Cesare's Dream* is one of the highlights of the exhibition. This volumetric film enables visitors to immerse themselves in the three–dimensional space of the *Caligari* film and to move virtually within it — perhaps a little like the reawakened Cesare one hundred years ago: a being, controlled by others, wandering between reality and fiction.
